

LAETARE SUNDAY – Today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent. It is traditionally called “Laetare Sunday” and derives its Latin name from the first word of the Mass text, “Laetare Jerusalem” (Rejoice, O Jerusalem). It is a day of joy within the penitential season. The altars may be decorated with flowers, organ playing is permitted (not just to sustain singing), and the priests wear rose-colored vestments instead of violet. The reason for such display of joy is explained in a sermon by Pope Innocent III (1216): “On this Sunday, which marks the middle of Lent, a measure of consoling relaxation is provided, so that the faithful may not break down under the severe strain of Lenten fast but may continue to bear the restrictions with a refreshed and easier heart.” This “midway” point in Lent is a good time for us to examine the Lenten resolutions we made back on Ash Wednesday and see if we have been faithful to them. It is a time to renew those resolutions.

Next Sunday in many churches all the statues as well as the crucifix will be covered with purple cloth. The Fifth Sunday of Lent begins the last part of Lent which is called **Passiontide**. It includes the last full week of Lent (5th week) and Holy Week. In ancient times many of the crosses in churches were “gemmae,” that is, covered with jewels and without a corpus (body) or with a corpus of the risen Savior, a sign of the resurrection. These crosses were covered during Passiontide to help people meditate more on the sufferings of Jesus. If the crosses were covered, it was thought necessary to cover also all the other pictures and statues. In the course of years, especially influenced by Franciscan spirituality in the 13th century, the cross “evolved” and most crosses were crucifixes, vividly showing the death of Christ. However, the “covering custom” continued. The veil on the crucifix is removed during the Solemn Liturgy of Good Friday while the coverings of the statues are removed at the singing of the “Gloria” at the Easter Vigil.

SOLEMNITY OF ST. JOSEPH is transferred to Monday, March 20 with Mass at 6:30am, 8:00am, and 7:00pm.

ST. JOSEPH - “It’s worth remembering that Joseph, the husband of Mary and guardian of Jesus, was a *tekton*; a carpenter and builder. So was Jesus himself. Jesus would have known, from a very early age, the feeling of sweat and stone and wood, the sting of splinters in his hands, and the satisfaction of shaping raw material to human need. He would have learned from Joseph real skill at his labor and a respect for the ingenuity of his craft. But he also would have learned the proper place of his work and tools in a genuinely human life; a life shaped by prayer, study in the synagogue, love for his family and people, and a reverence for the Torah, the Word of God. He also would have understood the treasure of silence, and Scripture tells us that Jesus sought it out.” -Excerpt from *Things Worth Dying For: Thoughts on a Life Worth Living*, by Archbishop Charles Chaput, OFM Cap.

ALPHA is a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith. Each talk looks at a different question about faith and is designed to create conversation. No matter where you are in your faith journey, everyone is welcome. Alpha is offered by thousands of parishes around the world, endorsed by Catholic Bishops, Cardinals, and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Focusing on the kerygma—the initial proclamation of the Good News—Alpha introduces us to an encounter with Jesus.

St. Anthony parishioners who have participated in past Alpha programs say that it has deepened their relationship with Jesus and connected them to new friends in our church community through food, inspiring talks, and good conversation. We invite you to take this next step where you get to walk with Jesus over these next eight weeks, as you come to know more about who He is for you and your life. **Alpha begins on March 29th and continues every Wednesday from 7:00-8:30pm at the parish hall.**

LENTEN PRACTICES - There are three practices that are encouraged for everyone in our parish: regular Confession, frequent Mass (perhaps several times during the week) and weekly Stations of the Cross. Our Stations of the Cross each Friday will be at 7:00pm in both English and Spanish. Come and pray this beautiful devotion with your parish family.

DOMINGO DE LAETARE - Hoy celebramos el cuarto domingo de Cuaresma. Se le llama tradicionalmente "Domingo de Laetare" y deriva su nombre latino de la primera palabra del texto de la Misa, "Laetare Jerusalén" (Regocíjate, Oh Jerusalén). Es un día de alegría dentro de la temporada de duelo. Los altares pueden estar decorados con flores, se permite tocar el órgano (no solo para sostener el canto) y los sacerdotes usan vestimentas de color rosa en lugar de violeta. El motivo de tal exhibición de alegría se explica en un sermón del Papa Inocencio III (1216): "En este domingo, que marca la mitad de la Cuaresma, se proporciona una medida de relajación consoladora, para que los fieles no se derrumben bajo el severa tensión del ayuno de Cuaresma, pero puede continuar soportando las restricciones con un corazón renovado y más tranquilo ". Este "punto medio" de la Cuaresma es un buen momento para que examinemos las resoluciones de Cuaresma que hicimos el Miércoles de Ceniza y veamos si hemos sido fieles a ellas. Es el momento de renovar esas resoluciones.

El próximo domingo en muchas iglesias todas las estatuas, así como el crucifijo, estarán cubiertos con tela púrpura. El quinto domingo de Cuaresma comienza la última parte de la Cuaresma que se llama **Passiontide**. Incluye la última semana completa de Cuaresma (quinta semana) y Semana Santa. En la antigüedad, muchas de las cruces en las iglesias eran "gemmae", es decir, cubiertas de joyas y sin un corpus (cuerpo) o con un corpus del Salvador resucitado, una señal de la resurrección. Estas cruces se cubrieron durante Passiontide para ayudar a las personas a meditar más sobre los sufrimientos de Jesús. Si se cubrieron las cruces, se consideró necesario cubrir también todos los demás cuadros y estatuas. En el transcurso de los años, especialmente influenciada por la espiritualidad franciscana en el siglo XIII, la cruz "evolucionó" y la mayoría de las cruces fueron crucifijos, mostrando vívidamente la muerte de Cristo. Sin embargo, la "costumbre de cubrir" continuó. El velo del crucifijo se quita durante la liturgia solemne del Viernes Santo, mientras que las cubiertas de las estatuas se quitan al cantar la "Gloria" en la Vigilia Pascual.

SOLEMNIDAD DE SAN JOSE se celebrará el lunes, 20 de marzo con Misa en inglés a las 6:30am, 8:00am, y 7:00pm.

SAN JOSE - “Vale la pena recordar que José, el esposo de María y guardián de Jesús, era un *tekton*; carpintero y constructor. También Jesús mismo. Jesús habría conocido, desde muy temprana edad, la sensación del sudor y la piedra y la madera, el escozor de astillas en sus manos y la satisfacción de dar forma a la materia prima a la necesidad humana. Habría aprendido de Jose una verdadera habilidad en su trabajo y un respeto por el ingenio de su oficio. Pero también habría aprendido el lugar adecuado de su trabajo y sus herramientas en una vida genuinamente humana;

una vida moldeada por la oración, el estudio en la sinagoga, el amor por su familia y su gente, y una reverencia por la Torá, la Palabra de Dios. Él también habría entendido el tesoro del silencio, y la Escritura nos dice que Jesús lo buscó”.




In this Lenten retreat Fr. Mullady addresses who Christ is in our lives.

He has had fourteen series on Mother Angelica's EWTN television network. He is the author of four books and numerous articles and writes the Answer column in *Homiletic and Pastoral Review*. He is also designated as an official Missionary of Mercy by Pope Francis. In addition to numerous books and series on EWTN. Fr. Mullady has a weekly national radio program on EWTN network called Open Line Thursday.
