**WEEKLY HOLY HOUR OF EUCHARISTIC ADORATION**

- Beginning on Friday, January 26 we will add weekly Eucharistic Adoration and Confessions to each Friday (with a few exceptions). On a normal Friday, the Holy Hour, Adoration, and Confessions will run from 6:15pm through 7:15pm. On First Fridays, most holy days of obligations and their vigils that fall on a Friday, a bilingual Mass will begin at 6:15pm with Holy Hour, Adoration, and Confessions after Mass until 8:15pm. During Fridays of Lent, bilingual Stations of the Cross will begin at 6:15pm and will be followed by Holy Hour, Adoration, and Confessions. But please note that our next First Friday Mass, February 2, will begin at 6:15pm and not 7:00pm.

**"ORDINARY TIME"** - Having finished the Christmas Season with last week's celebration of the Baptism of the

Lord, we begin the liturgical season called "Ordinary Time." The term "Ordinary Time" may be misleading. In the context of the liturgical year the term "ordinary" does not mean "usual or average." Ordinary here means "not seasonal." Ordinary Time is that part of the Liturgical Year that lies outside the seasons of Lent-Easter and Advent-Christmas. In Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ not in one specific aspect but in all its aspects. The readings during the liturgies of Ordinary Time help to instruct us on how to live out our Christian faith in our daily lives. Ordinary Time in the Church's year occurs in two sections. The first part begins on the Monday following the Christmas season and lasts through the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, which begins Lent. Ordinary Time then resumes after the Easter Season, on the Monday after Pentecost, and continues through the summer until the beginning of Advent. The liturgical color of Ordinary Time is green which is a symbol of hope.

**DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN**

**- The over 56 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture."** However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 373, designates **January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children"**: "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms. Another way to take part is through participating in special events to observe the anniversary of Roe v. Wade. The Archdiocese conducts the Annual One Life LA March downtown beginning on Olvera Street at 11am on Saturday, January 20. The Annual Requiem for the Unborn Mass at the Cathedral begins at 5:00pm.

**ANNUAL NATIONAL CATHOLIC SCHOOLS' WEEK**

begins on Jan 28. Our All School Mass is at 11:00am and the Open House is at the school from 12noon until 2pm. We plan to have entertainment in the Hall at the same time. There will be a variety of speakers after Communion at each Mass starting at 5:30pm Mass on Saturday, January 27, all Masses on Sunday, January 28.

**CONGRATULATIONS** – A few months ago, **Fr. Jim Anguiano** was appointed Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia by Archbishop Gomez. He had been serving as Vicar for Clergy. Fr. Jim lived "in residence" here at St. Anthony's from 2008-2018. **Fr. Joel Henson**, former Associate Vicar for Clergy, replaced Fr. Jim as Vicar for Clergy. This past week, Archbishop Gomez appointed **Fr. Mike Perucho** (Vocation Director of the Archdiocese) as the new Associate Vicar for Clergy. In three years, he becomes Vicar for Clergy. Fr. Mike also has a St.

Anthony connection. As a seminarian he was assigned to our parish during his five years in the seminary. Prior to that, he taught chemistry at Serra High when I was principal. Congratulations to Fr. Jim, Fr. Joel, and Fr. Mike. Our parish is proud of their accomplishments. Please pray for them as they serve the people of the archdiocese in these very difficult and important positions.

**DID YOU KNOW? - How to actively listen to abuse disclosures** - Disclosing abuse is one of the hardest — and most important — steps for a victim to take. If a child chooses to tell you about abuse, make sure you are actively listening. Give the child all of your attention and listen calmly, without making judgements or assumptions. Listen patiently without filling in the blanks or making suggestions. The best thing is for the child to tell his or her own story. Ask limited questions, and only for information needed to report abuse. **HORA SANTA SEMANAL DE ADORACIÓN EUCARÍSTICA** - A partir del viernes 26 de enero agregaremos Adoración Eucarística y Confesiones semanales a cada viernes (con algunas excepciones). En un viernes normal, la Hora Santa, la Adoración y las Confesiones se realizarán de 6:15pm a 7:15pm. Los primeros viernes, en más días de obligaciones y sus vigencias que cae un viernes, una Misa bilingüe comenzará a las 6:15pm con Hora Santa, Adoración y Confesiones después de la Misa hasta las 8:15pm. Durante los viernes de Cuaresma, el Vía Crucis bilingüe comenzará a las 6:15pm y será seguido por la Hora Santa, Adoración y Confesiones. Pero tenga en cuenta que nuestra próxima Misa del primer viernes, 2 de febrero, comenzará a las 6:15pm y no a las 7:00pm.

**“TIEMPO ORDINARIO”** - Habiendo terminado la temporada navideña con la celebración del Bautismo del Señor la semana pasada, comenzamos la temporada litúrgica llamada “Tiempo ordinario”. El término “Tiempo ordinario” puede ser engañoso. En el contexto del año litúrgico, el término “ordinario” no significa “habitual o promedio”. Ordinario aquí significa “no estacional”. El tiempo ordinario es esa parte del año litúrgico que se encuentra fuera de las estaciones de Cuaresma-Pascua y Adviento-Navidad. En el tiempo ordinario, la Iglesia celebra el misterio de Cristo no en un aspecto específico sino en todos sus aspectos. Las lecturas durante las liturgias del tiempo ordinario ayudan a instruirnos sobre cómo vivir nuestra fe cristiana en nuestra vida diaria. El tiempo ordinario

en el año de la Iglesia ocurre en dos secciones. La primera parte comienza el lunes siguiente a la temporada navideña y dura hasta el martes anterior al Miércoles de Ceniza, que comienza la Cuaresma. El tiempo ordinario se reanuda después de la temporada de Pascua, el lunes después de Pentecostés, y continúa durante el verano hasta el comienzo del Adviento. El color litúrgico del tiempo ordinario es el verde, que es un símbolo de esperanza.

**LA SEMANA ANUAL DE LAS ESCUELAS CATÓLICAS** comienza el 28 de enero. Nuestra misa para toda la escuela es a las 11:00am y la Casa Abierta es en la escuela desde las 12 del mediodía hasta las 2:00pm. Planeamos tener entretenimiento en el Salón al mismo tiempo. Habrá una variedad de oradores después de la Comunión en cada Misa comenzando en la Misa de las 5:30pm el sábado 27 de enero, todas las Misas el domingo 28 de enero.

**¿SABÍA QUE? - Cómo escuchar con atención cuando se le revela un abuso** - Revelar el abuso es uno de los pasos más difíciles (y más importantes) que da una víctima de abuso. Si un niño elige contarte sobre el abuso sufrido, asegúrate de escucharlo con atención. Preste al niño su absoluta atención y escúchale con calma, sin emitir juicios ni suposiciones. Escuche pacientemente sin llenar los espacios en blanco ni hacer sugerencias. Lo mejor es que el niño cuente su propia historia. Haga preguntas limitadas y solo para obtener información necesaria para denunciar los abusos.
